MEETING INFORMATION

VENUE

The meeting will be held in Robinson College, which is the newest college in the University of Cambridge. It was founded with a donation by the entrepreneur and philanthropist Sir David Robinson and formally opened in 1981. The whole site centres around a large tranquil garden and lake. The College is situated approximately 10 minutes by taxi from the main railway station and the bus station (terminus for the airport coaches).

TRAVELLING TO CAMBRIDGE

Cambridge is situated in the heart of the East of England, 60 miles north of London. Excellent road and rail links ensure the city is accessible from all parts of the UK (London is just over an hour away by train, www.nationalrail.co.uk). London Stansted Airport (served by EasyJet and Ryanair) is 30 miles south of the city, with easy access by train, car or coach (National Express Coaches, which also serves Heathrow and Gatwick Airports, www.nationalexpress.com).
