Dear Colleague,

We are pleased to invite you to attend the Annual Scientific Meeting of the British Hypertension Society, which will be held from **Monday 12th to Wednesday 14th September 2011** in **Queens' College, Cambridge, UK**.

For the first time in its 30 year history, the Society is delighted to open the doors to its Annual Scientific Meeting to both members and non-members and, in particular, we hope to welcome overseas visitors representing other national hypertension and cardiovascular societies. Other changes which have been made this year to the format include the introduction of day delegate rates and separate fees for registration, accommodation and social events to allow more flexibility in attendance.

The meeting will commence on Monday afternoon with a session dedicated to the NICE Hypertension Guidelines, which will have been launched just prior to this year's BHS annual congress. The Chairman of the NICE Hypertension Guideline Development Group, Professor Bryan Williams, together with some of the Group's other members, will present the new hypertension guidelines and then invite the audience to participate in an active, frank and lively discussion about their content, delivery and implementation. The programme then will move into oral presentations of the highest quality research, being considered for the Young Investigators' Awards.

The full congress programme includes presentations by invited speakers on a broad range of topics including sleep and cardiovascular disease, blood pressure variability, cardiovascular imaging in the hypertensive patient, further new research presentations and posters, plus presentations of new research and topical discussion from the Nurses' Working Party. We are particularly pleased that one of our founding members and past-Presidents, Professor Peter Sever, will be giving this year's Sir George Pickering Lecture. There will be discussion of interesting and unusual clinical cases, as well as presentations of the latest data emerging from clinical trials during 2011. We are also looking forward to an entertaining post-dinner debate between Anna Dominiczak and Neil Poulter, refereed by Ian Wilkinson!

The BHS welcomes abstracts for both oral and poster presentations and further information can be found in this Announcement. The presentation of data at this meeting will provide the opportunity for scientific interaction and discussion with a highly informed audience. The Society will provide prestigious prizes for the best oral and poster presentations by young investigators. All accepted abstracts will be published in the *Journal of Human Hypertension*.

We look forward to receiving your abstract submissions and to seeing you at the Society's Annual Scientific Meeting in September.

CONFERENCE INFORMATION

VENUE

Queens' College (www.queens.cam.ac.uk) which is one of the most beautiful Colleges in Cambridge, incorporating the old with the new. First founded in 1448 by Margaret of Anjou and then, unusually, again in 1465 by Elizabeth Woodville, Queens' is fiercely proud of its royal patronesses, including its most recent, Her Majesty The Queen. Queens' sits astride the River Cam with its two halves joined across the river by the famous Mathematical Bridge.

The College is situated in the centre of Cambridge, approximately 5-10 minutes by taxi from the main railway station and the bus station (terminus for the airport coaches).



TRAVELLING TO CAMBRIDGE

Cambridge is situated in the heart of the East of England, 60 miles north of London. Excellent road and rail links ensure the city is accessible from all parts of the UK. London is 45 minutes away by train, twice an hour (www.nationalrail.co.uk) and three hours from Paris by Eurostar which arrives into St Pancras International station. The nearest airport to Cambridge is London Stansted located 30 miles south of the city. The airport has easy access by train, car or coach (National Express Coaches, which also serves London Heathrow and London Gatwick Airports, www.nationalexpress.com).

PARKING

Parking spaces are available in the Wilberforce Road University Sports Ground, which is a 20 minute walk from Queens' College. Delegates wishing to purchase car parking permits (£8.00 per day) are requested to indicate their requirements when they register for the meeting. Please note that this is not a secure car park and cars will be left at the owners' risk. Car park permits and directions to the car park will be sent to delegates who have pre-booked a car parking space before the meeting.

Parking is also available for delegates staying in either the Doubletree by Hilton Hotel or the Royal Cambridge Hotel (please see under 'Accommodation Description and Costs' for more information).

Queens' College

There is limited availability of each type of room and rooms will be booked on a first-come, first-served basis.

Hotel Accommodation

For delegates not wishing to stay in Queens' College, the Conference Secretariat has reserved an allocation of rooms at two local hotels, both situated within walking distance of Queens' College. WINNERS OF THE YOUNG INVESTIGATOR AWARDS WHO ARE NOT YET MEMBERS OF THE BHS WILL BE STRONGLY ENCOURAGED TO APPLY FOR MEMBERSHIP OF THE SOCIETY

ORAL PRIZES:

There will be two Young Investigator Oral Sessions during the meeting, each giving a prize of £250 for the best presentation. The winner of the *overall* best oral presentation will be given the opportunity of presenting their abstract at the December meeting of the High Blood Pressure Research Council of Australia (HBPRCA, www.hbprca.com.au). The BHS will provide £1,500 towards travel expenses and subsistence, and the HBPRCA will cover the costs of conference registration and accommodation during the meeting. The winner of this award will be expected to arrange visits to relevant research groups in Australia before or after the meeting (assistance in contacting relevant units will be provided by the HBPRCA if required).

Judging Procedure

The oral abstracts which score the highest referees' gradings will be shortlisted for each Award by the Executive Committee in advance of the conference, and all presenters notified. The Executive Committee will assess the presentations at the meeting, using the following criteria:

- The merits of the overall study objectives and design
- The quality of the data and its presentation at the meeting
- The quality of the presenter's interaction during the question and answer session following their presentation

POSTER PRIZE:

The BHS is grateful to Dr. M. VandenBurg for donating £1,000 to provide an annual prize of £100 in memory of Professor Jack Ledingham. Poster presenters must be present during the Poster Discussion Session during an extended coffee break on Wednesday.

CONDITIONS:

Your attention is drawn to the fact that these three awards are directed towards investigators who are fundamentally involved in the design and prosecution of the work that they present and as such, a major contributor to that work. A guide to the level of contribution is that the presenter would ordinarily be expected to be the first author on any resulting publication. The following points are emphasised:

- To be considered for the award the investigator should be ≤ 35 years old at the time of the anticipated presentation of the data at the BHS Annual Meeting.
- The investigator should be the first-named author on the abstract.
- The named investigator should have been fundamentally involved in the design of the study and should have performed the work to be presented.
- The awards are not restricted to clinical investigators.
- Investigators wishing to be considered for these awards should tick the appropriate box on the on-line abstract submission site.

Presentation of Awards

The President of the BHS will present the successful oral presenters with their prizes at the Conference Dinner on Tuesday.
