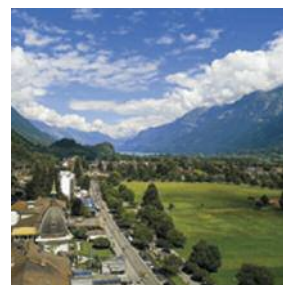
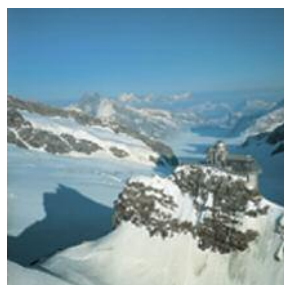
## The Venue-all in one
