WELCOME INVITATION

I wish you a warm Scottish welcome to the RCR Breast Group Annual Scientific Meeting 2011. This year our meeting takes place in the stunning Glasgow IMAX cinema and Science Centre. The cinema has tiered seating giving a great view of the speakers and presentations. Each delegate will have an interactive control panel for voting and instant audience feedback. You can start 'buzzing' during the first session, which is an interactive multidisciplinary meeting. Pit yourself against experts such as Julia Camps Herrero, from Valencia and Elizabeth Morris from Sloan-Kettering. See if your management agrees with theirs. Dr Iona Heath, President of the Royal College of General Practitioners and "screening skeptic" will give her views on how screening needs to change before she will attend for her mammogram. Later Julietta Patnick, national director of the NHS Cancer Screening will join us for 'Question Time' (please send me your questions in advance) and she will attempt to explain how the Coalition government intends to commission and govern breast screening. Robin Wilson from the Royal Marsden Hospital will give two talks, one on extending screening to include higher risk younger women, and the other on how to avoid making embarrassing newspaper headlines.

This new conference centre overlooks the Clyde River. It is a few minutes from Glasgow city centre by tube and there are hotels within a couple of minutes walk. The Science Centre has an interactive exhibition and if you register for the conference dinner you can test your reflexes and coordination on the exhibits during the reception.

The Breast Imaging Research Network Workshop will again be running on the Sunday afternoon preceding the main meeting, and will be free for trainees and students who register for Monday and Tuesday. The workshop is in the Crowne Plaza Hotel opposite the Science Centre. We will be highlighting the gaps in the evidence for breast imaging as demonstrated by the recent MBUR7 exercise. The workshop is the place to publicise ongoing trials and discuss your ideas for future research. If you want to present, please let me know and you can have a spot during the workshop, or you can make an informal contribution from the floor. I hope you will be able to attend.

There were a record number of high quality proffered papers and posters in 2010. We look forward to even more in 2011. First authors of accepted abstracts who are students will have free registration. Similarly the top 5 trainee abstracts will have their meeting fee waived. Accepted research abstracts will be published in 'Breast Cancer Research' and full presentations can be found at our website in advance of the meeting. There will also be a poster quiz with prizes. Main authors will be by their posters to discuss them during the first half of the Tuesday lunch break.

This announcement includes details on how to submit an abstract, together with a registration form. If you register early you will find better hotels and travel deals. It is worth looking online before booking the conference hotel through the conference registration site – sometimes booking directly or through a price comparison sites gives better value.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PREPARATION OF ABSTRACTS

Abstract submissions are very much encouraged and there will be prizes awarded for the best oral and the best poster presentation. The winner of each category will be notified at the close of the meeting. Please read the Instructions for Preparation of Abstracts carefully before submitting it.

First authors of accepted abstracts who are **students** will get free registration. Similarly the top five trainee abstracts, scored at review, will also be awarded free registration.

ABSTRACT PUBLICATION – BREAST CANCER RESEARCH

Accepted **research** abstracts will be published **online** in the journal Breast Cancer Research. **ONLY** research abstracts will be published in the Journal. However **ALL** accepted abstracts for the 2010 conference will be published separately on the Royal College of Radiologists Breast Group website. Poster authors will be asked to provide PDF copies of their poster which will be displayed on the RCR Breast Group website prior to the conference. Accepted oral presenters will be asked to submit a PDF PowerPoint copy of their presentation which will be available to download from the RCR Breast Group website after the conference.

GUIDANCE INSTRUCTIONS FOR A SCIENTIFIC ABSTRACT

The purpose of the abstract is to convey as concisely and clearly as possible the findings of the research. Abstracts should include details of work performed and actual results rather than statements of intent. The abstract should be divided into four sections – the introduction, methods, results and conclusions.

The **introduction** should state the nature of the problem and the purpose of the research or the question to be answered by the study. A summary of the context or background informing the study should also be included.

The **methods** should state the subjects enrolled and in what setting, how they were recruited, what test was undertaken, how the test was done, how the results were analysed and by whom and what statistical tests were undertaken.

The **results** should state the number and sex of subjects recruited, the findings of the test e.g. sensitivity and specificity, and actual numbers in brackets (number positive/total number and number negative/total number) together with the appropriate statistical test. There may be several results to give in this section.

The **conclusion** should state the significance of the findings and how the results of the study will impact on current practice. Comments on any further work required to validate the findings should also be included.

GUIDANCE INSTRUCTIONS FOR AN EDUCATIONAL ABSTRACT

The purpose of the abstract is to outline clearly and concisely the aim and the messages of the presentation. The abstract should contain clear learning objectives, for example: to recognise...to correctly identify.....to understand..... etc.

It should state the background context for these objectives and include justification of why they are important.

The abstract should state how these objectives are to be met and give details. For example, if it is a case series or pictorial review, details should be given of the number of cases and a summary of the range of findings that will be presented.

Abstracts should be submitted ON-LINE at www.hamptonmedical.com

Abstracts must be submitted using the Abstract Template. This will be e-mailed to you when you register your correspondence details with the abstract submission system.

To register on the submission site and submit an abstract, the author should:

- Access the Secretariat's website at www.hamptonmedical.com
- Click on On-line Services, Abstract Submission, RCR 2011.
- Follow the instructions provided for 'First Time Users' to register your email address, correspondence details and to create your own password.
- Once you have registered, you will receive an automatic email confirming your password. You will receive guidance notes for the preparation of abstracts, and the official Microsoft Word abstract template. These can also be downloaded from the on-line system at any time.

ABSTRACT SIZE

- The maximum number of words is 250 including references (if you add a table or graphics to your abstract, please be aware that this will reduce the number of words you can submit). This does not include the abstract title, authors or their institutions.
- Do not alter the size of the template to enable you to submit a longer abstract. Abstracts are checked for size and rejected if too long.
- Abstracts may be reduced in size for printing, so all lettering/symbols/lines should be clear and distinct.
- Abstracts should be typed single-spaced with minimum type size 11 point, using Arial font only. If you think you may need to use other fonts, please contact the Secretariat before submitting it.
- Abstracts must be submitted in English.

ABSTRACT CONTENT

- Do not use any abbreviations in the abstract title.
- Use standard abbreviations only and place any unusual abbreviation in parenthesis after the full word the first time it appears.
- Use generic names of drugs. References should be kept to a minimum and, ideally, should be consistently presented in Vancouver (numbered) style.
- Tables should not be tabbed text, but instead should be produced using the word-processing package 'Table'.
- If reference is made to proprietary pharmaceutical products or equipment, the manufacturer's name and location should be included in parentheses.
