WELCOME INVITATION

Dear Colleague,

We are pleased to invite you to attend the first UK meeting on Renal Denervation on **Wednesday 5th October 2011** at The Royal College of Physicians, London hosted, jointly by the British Hypertension Society and the Barts and The London NIHR Cardiovascular Biomedical Research Unit. This educational symposium is aimed at interventional cardiologists, interventional radiologists, nephrologists and secondary care physicians with a special interest in hypertension.

Over the past 20 years there has been growing interest in the role of the sympathetic nervous system in the initiation and perpetuation of the hypertensive state. With this has come the recognition of the crucial role of the renal sympathetic nervous system in hypertension in nearly all its forms. Pioneering work has recently led to the development of endovascular renal denervation as a means to achieve selective renal sympathectomy to treat hypertension. This potentially represents the most significant breakthrough in hypertension therapy since the advent of anti-hypertensive pharmacotherapy more than 50 years ago. The publication of the Symplicity HTN-2 study in The Lancet in December 2010 has confirmed that renal denervation therapy is both safe and highly effective in lowering blood pressure in patients with resistant hypertension and there is now an urgent need to develop our understanding of this innovative therapy which could be of substantial benefit to many patients with hypertension worldwide.

The symposium is designed to educate physicians further about hypertension, the role of the sympathetic nervous system and in particular all aspects of renal denervation. The full congress programme includes presentations by invited speakers who have been instrumental in the development of the technology and the science behind it as well as talks from internationally recognised UK Hypertension specialists. Attendees will be shown how to undertake renal denervation and the need for a multidisciplinary approach to using this therapy will be highlighted. Whilst we are at an early stage in the genesis of this exciting therapy, our programme will also help to demonstrate why it may be beneficial not only in hypertension but also a number of other conditions characterised by increased activation of the sympathetic nervous system such as heart failure and diabetes mellitus.

We look forward to welcoming you to this exciting meeting, the first of its kind in the UK.
